A JOURNEY OF HOPE THROUGH THE MONTH OF MARCH It's a 3:16 month!



"It's a twenty-six-word parade of hope: beginning with God, ending with life, and urging us to do the same. Brief enough to write on a napkin or memorize in a moment, yet solid enough to weather two thousand years of storms and questions. If you know nothing of the Bible, start here. If you know everything in the Bible, return here. Embark on a journey of hope and encouragement with Max Lucado as he unpacks the powerful message of John 3:16." oneplace.com.

Join the journey at NSCC with the new quarter of Sunday School classes, a five-week sermon series that highlights the message of 3:16, Hope, Love, Giving, Believing, and Living, and a six-week small group study. The study will be from March 2nd—April 12th based on the 3:16 DVD messages by Max Lucado. You can sign up for one of the studies by filling out the attached insert and placing it in the offering.

There will be a Leadership Family Pizza and Salad Dinner on Sunday, March 9th at 5:00 followed by a strategy meeting. This is an opportunity for our newly named leaders and their families to fellowship and to get acquainted with all the ministry departments and consider where they would like to serve. Nursery and childcare will be provided.

On Palm Sunday we would like to have about 40 people to remain after worship, enjoy lunch together and then evangelize the neighborhood by inviting 316 people to come to NSCC on Easter. Tracts will be available to help with the evangelism effort. In addition, 316 invitations will be distributed during worship to be given to friends, neighbors, and to whom the Lord may lead.

Then on Easter Sunday, we hope to have the church filled with everyone who received an invitation as well as those who gave them. There will be a sunrise service at 6:45 followed by breakfast at 8:00, and worship at 9:30. No Sunday school classes will be held.

Since March 30 is the fifth Sunday, we will follow the plan for months with five Sundays. There will be one service that day. Sunday School will be at 9:00 and Worship will be at 10:15.

HAVING A MARY SPIRIT- ALLOWING GOD TO CHANGE US FROM THE INSIDE OUT - Taught by Sam Tait and Sherry O'Donnell in Room 103, this is a continuation of last quarter's study.

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE DEATH, BURIAL and RESURRECTION of JESUS CHRIST. Join Pastor Bob in the Dining Room (Room 105) for an in depth study of the theological significance of the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ. ANSWERS ACADEMY - The purpose of the bold new Answers Academy apologetics curriculum is to equip students to answer the questions the world is asking about the authority and accuracy of the Bible. During the quarter, students will discover why it is vital to provide answers to skeptics and how to give those answers with a solid understanding of what the Bible says about biology, geology, and astronomy. Students will learn that, contrary to popular belief, operational science runs counter to the idea of evolution and "millions of years." Taught by Terry Hartman in Room 102, this class is for Junior High grades 7 and 8.

It is about 5:00 a.m. on Wednesday morning February 19, 2008. The roosters are crowing. Another day in Thailand is awakening. An unusual but cooling, cleansing rain came last evening. We will be able to see clearly in the distance today.

We travelers are faring well. Our pattern seems to be: eat, go to Church, eat, rest, go to Church, eat, sleep. (The food is cheap, interesting and different but delicious most of the time.) There are daily diversions – things like buying some tires at a Goodyear store, checking out a local handmade paper umbrella manufacturer or the Night Bazaar, going to the Post Office, a little shopping each day and my favorite – people watching. Four on one motorbike never ceases to amaze me!

We have been to Chiang Dao to visit the Children's Ministry and to attend the opening of new missions school sponsored by Dr. Ted Hope and OMF International.

We have been participating in the Bible Conference each day this week.

Today after lunch, all present will attend the funeral of the mother of one of the Thai families of the Church here in Chiang Mai. Next week we will head to the north spending time with our Christian brothers and sisters in several of the Hill Tribe Village Churches.

People, leadership issues, Church decisions, family matters, kids and culture, struggling against sin, victory in Jesus, enthusiasm for God's ways – all things positive and negative seem to be the same worldwide.

I know more than ever that just as we inhale and exhale that we also need to breathe in and breathe out the love, grace and mercy of God. His ways are ever before us and are most wonderful.

Some recent life lessons for me have been: As we teach, we learn. As we give, we receive. The farther we travel from home, the smaller the world becomes. People may look different on the outside but are the same inside. As we hold a

magnifying glass toward the lives of others, the mirror before us becomes more clear and sometimes uncomfortably so. The greatest lesson - For certain, people need the Lord! He is our deliverer, our counselor, our teacher, our vision, our rock, our glory and our hope.
