A word from Pastor Bob TUNED IN TO ONE VOICE Discernment in the voice of Christ

Recently I read an account of a missionary who distributed 800 radios to a remote African village. The radios were unique in that they were capable of receiving only one radio station. That station was a Christian one and the hopes were high as to how God would use the creative idea. Sadly rebels from a nearby village stole all 800 of the radios. Incredibly though, over half of the 1000 people in that village came to Christ as a result of tuning in to the only station the radios received!

Options, choices, variety are valued by us. Freedom to exercise our preferences are nearly a right in our minds. From the kind of vehicle we drive, to the places we choose to shop and eat, to where our kids will go to school, to our style of dress - there is so much sub-culture in our culture. (Interestingly, the choices made in our freedoms seem to communicate a cultural homogeny more than individuality.) Similar options are also visible in Church culture. Music, dress, architecture, media, preaching style, formality, informality all communicate to others just where we fit and what kind of people we are.

In the midst of our exercising of these freedoms, I would like to cry out as a watchman to say that more importantly than exercising all of the options that are ours, we must decide ahead of time that God has

told us through His Word that there in only ONE VOICE that is truth and provides the freedom of righteousness - of course that VOICE is the voice of Jesus, His Son.

There are so many choices that come to us in the name of Jesus. They may come in the form of the latest book, a concert or seminar or new study or retreat. Please use discernment in making your choice as to whether you should be influenced by the message promoted. Compare the message to the Word of God through the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Ask, "Is this the voice of Jesus?"

A.W. Tozer said, "Many tender-minded Christians fear to sin against love by daring to inquire into anything that comes wearing the cloak of Christianity and breathing the name of Jesus . . . Gullibility is not synonymous with spirituality. Faith is not a mental habit leading its possessor to open his mouth and swallow everything that has about it the color of the supernatural. Faith keeps its heart open to whatever is of God, and rejects everything that is not of God, however wonderful it may be. Try the spirits is a command of the Holy Spirit to the Church . . . To appraise things with a heart of love and then to act on the results is an obligation resting upon every Christian in the world. And the more as we see the day approaching."

Before making any other choices, first tune in to the ONE VOICE of Jesus Christ, found in the Word, and then all of the spiritual options will be more easily aligned. To what channel have you been listening?
