EASTER SUNDAY MESSAGE JESUS CHRIST: IN A BONE BOX OR ON THE THRONE OF HEAVEN? "CRUCIFIED, RESURRECTED AND ASCENDED OR JUST PLAIN DEAD?"

Have you noticed that when a Christian Holiday is celebrated that there is a counter effort from the media to bring into question and sometimes discredit the orthodox meaning and celebration of that holiday? (Holy Day)

It is not by consequence that last year, The Da Vinci Code was released about a month following Easter. (And it was scheduled to be released sooner, but legal matters delayed it, if you remember.) The Code claims that the Church has covered up the truth about Jesus actually being married to Mary of Magdala, that they have living descendants today and that He was a mere man. To reveal this would cause the Church (Catholic) to lose it's power and authority!

This year a television program entitled The Lost Tomb of Jesus was aired. It revealed that a tomb containing 10 ossuaries (a small limestone casket used to hold the bones of the dead) was discovered. One ossuary

had the inscription of the names of a man named Jesus, a woman name Mariame and their son named Jude! Of course, the postulation was in support of the idea that this was Jesus of Nazareth and that He really did marry Mary of Magdala and that they did have a son together. Closely DaVinci as you can see!

Just this week a segment was given on a national network news program to The Gospel of Judas which communicates that Judas was not a traitor but the closest of the disciples. Supposedly at Jesus' request he betrayed Him to allow Him to be released from His flesh, allowing the true spiritual being to be released - only truly understood by the enlightened from a gnostic (secret/hidden knowledge) sense. Skepticism is not new! Even from the time of Jesus' life we discover that some of those closest to Him had a hard time believing. Judas betrayed Him. Peter denied Him. Thomas

doubted Him. James, His own half-brother was an unbeliever turned Church Father. The Apostle Paul, one time enemy of the Church, fought against His Lordship too! UNBELIEF is ancient and nothing that should rattle our faith.

On Easter Sunday, a challenge will be issued to "always be prepared to give a defense to everyone who asks concerning the reason for the hope that is within us." Jesus cannot be dead and alive at the same time. His bones cannot have been housed in an ossuary and He be bodily crucified, bodily resurrected and bodily ascended, now sitting on the Throne of Heaven at the same time. He cannot be turned to dust and coming again at the same time!

Easter is about the HOPE we have in JESUS CHRIST! The truth about His Resurrection is that which validates or annihilates your faith! Bring your believing and unbelieving friends. Faith comes by hearing!

HELP WANTED

The subject matter that appears in newsletters is virtually endless. You can include stories that focus on current technologies or innovations in your field.

You may also want to note business or economic trends, or make predictions for your customers or clients.

If the newsletter is distributed internally, you might comment upon new procedures or improvements to the business. Sales figures or earnings will show how your business is growing.

Some newsletters include a column that is updated every issue, for instance, an advice column, a book review, a letter from the president, or an edito-

rial. You can also profile new employees or top customers or vendors.

Selecting pictures or graphics is an important part of adding content to your newsletter.

Think about your article and ask yourself if the picture supports or enhances the message you're trying to convey. Avoid selecting images that appear to be out of context.

Microsoft Publisher includes thousands of clip art images from which you can choose and import into your newsletter. There are also several tools you can use to draw shapes and symbols.

Once you have chosen an image, place it close to the article. Be sure to place the caption of the image near the image.

Back Page Story Headline

This story can fit 175-225 words.

If your newsletter is folded and mailed, this story will appear on the back. So, it's a good idea to make it easy to read at a glance.

A question and answer session is a good way to quickly capture the attention of readers. You can either compile questions that you've received since the last edition or you can summarize some generic questions that are frequently asked about your organization.

A listing of names and titles of managers in your organization is a good way to give your newsletter a personal touch. If your organization is small, you may want to list the names of all employees.

If you have any prices of standard products or services, you can include a listing of those here. You may want to refer your readers to any other forms of communication that you've created for your organization.

You can also use this space to remind readers to mark their calendars for a regular event, such as a breakfast meeting for vendors every third Tuesday of the month, or a biannual charity auction.

If space is available, this is

a good place to insert a clip art image or some other graphic.
