# A word to the men! Pursuing Success That Matters

### Men are tired and bored but have no time to THINK!

Acquisition is the name of the game if by observation an onlooker would coin a phrase to describe men and their pursuits of success. But it seems that even though many men are attaining the goals they set for themselves that they are not yet satisfied and best evaluation would say that it is because they are attaining success that really doesn't matter! After months and months of planning and training and work, Sir Edmund Hillary reached the summit of Mt. Everest - and he only stayed 15 minutes! That is a good picture of how the meaningless pursuits of our lives seem to be so worth it until we attain them! Once attained - it's on to the next thing!

Too often, the bored and tired eventually move on not just to a new hobby, or a new career but abandon their faith and their wife and their children looking for something or someone else who can make them happy. Men who have done so, in a moment of perfect honesty, would admit they still haven't found what they are looking for, but most times personal pride won't allow them to say it.

Experience teaches us that *life does not* go in a straight line. No matter how well prepared, how talented, how educated, how successful we are – life does not always go as planned. Here are some keys to finding success that matters:

- 1. Significance answer the question, "Whose am I?" before answering "Who am I?" Find significance in viewing life from God's perspective rather than simply from an earthly view. God uses men who first come to the end of themselves. Prioritize everything you do based on who will be crying at your funeral!
- 2. Career somehow we convince ourselves that success is having a dynamic career and that money will solve most problems. NOT! No amount of success at work can compensate for success at home. A dynamic career and more money are not the deepest needs of your wife and children what they want more of is YOU!!
- 3. Home A child's deepest need from their own father is encouragement, which rightly defined means to inspire courage! Men are experts at either too much structure or too little structure what kids need more than more rules or less rules is a relationship with their DAD. Use encouraging words, (learn to say I love you and I am proud of you) spend time with your kids and pray for them.

Your wife wants you to give her first place in your life in the same

way she gives you first place in her life. Unconditional acceptance, listening deeply, spending time with her alone, hearing encouraging words, being best friends are just some of the things that are big on her list! Get out your wallet - really - have a picture of your boss? Nope, I'll bet it's the wife and kids.

So men, do you want success that really matters? Live life by a higher, deeper motivation. Find significance from an eternal view rather than a temporal one. Make home a priority - be the leader, the protector, the provider. Speak to God about the family and to the family about God.

But that's not all – we all need to stay spiritually sharpened. We must go deeper in our personal relationship with God and must rub shoulders with other Godly men. That will be the subject of next week's column.
