NOT ALL CHRISTIANS ARE SUPERSTARS

I think it is true for all of us that we tend to naturally look up to the more visible and vocal personalities in our circle of friendships. We may even think from time to time, "I wish I was more like him/ her!" There are some great extroverts in this world. And there are some great introverts too! The same is true in Christ's kingdom.

I got to thinking about characters in the Bible and how we know the stories best that are about the people who stand out in vocal and visible ways. Who doesn't know something about David or Nehemiah or Peter or Paul? These and many others are the ones whom God has used to shape the history of His Kingdom and our lives. But there are bunches of others who are quietly used of God. I am thinking of people like Hannah and Elkanah, the parents of Samuel or the temple prophets Simeon and Anna who waited knowingly and patiently for the advent of the Messiah.

There are two quiet disciples of whom I would like us to contemplate. They are Joseph of Arimathea and Nicodemus. You can read about them in John 19:38-42 and in each of the other Gospels. These two men prepared Jesus' body for burial and laid Him in the tomb. I have asked, "Why wasn't it outspoken Peter?" "Why wasn't it the entire group of disciples?" "Where were the ones who normally were at the forefront?" It seems God works that way doesn't it!?!

Both of these men were Jewish leaders. Both are in the background most of the time. We don't know much else about Joseph until this event. He was a wealthy, dissenting member of the Sanhedrin and cared about Jesus. Nicodemus is the same of John 3 who met with Jesus in the night. Interestingly that scene with him closes without record of his decision, but we find him faithfully serving the Lord here at Jesus' death.

It appears to me that things are often quite the same. Some of us are typically out front leading way. Others are quietly in the background praying and supporting. When there are deeper intimate needs, often the typically visible ones are not so visible and the quiet ones come forward and minister and again without much notice. Praise God for the vocal ones and the quiet ones.

So you see, not all Christians are Superstars! Neither can we say that one type is more spiritual than the other. In God's design of things, He meets the needs of others through His people – both the vocal and visible ones and the quiet, less visible ones.
