FOLLOWING THE CROWD?

Throughout the Bible, the spiritual nature of humans is compared to the natural way of sheep. These days, in our cyber-world, I am sure the sheep/shepherd illustrations may not be easily translated, as our familiarity with sheep and their ways is not so common. First a brief lesson about sheep, and then a true story with some very practical application.

Sheep do best in a flock. Tests have actually shown that a group of four is more efficient in problem solving than one alone or even a group of two or three. Sheep are relatively defenseless especially when alone but are very vigilant and even more so when grouped as a flock. They are followers by nature and need a shepherd to guide them or else

will tend simply to do what the others do!

According to The Washington Post, near the village of Gevas in eastern Turkey, while shepherds ate their breakfast, one of their sheep jumped off a 45-foot cliff to its death. Then, as the stunned shepherds looked on, the rest of the flock followed. In all, 1,500 sheep mindlessly stumbled off the cliff. The only good news was that the last 1,000 were cushioned in their fall by the growing woolly pile of those who jumped first. It was reported that 450 of the sheep died! (Our Daily Bread) So often, we like sheep just follow the crowd. Mark DeHaan says, "Easily distracted and susceptible to group influence, we would rather follow the crowd than the wisdom of the Shepherd."

To whose voice do you listen most often? Shepherds who have their own benefit in mind? The "baaing" of other sheep? Your own voice? Or is it the voice of the Great Shepherd, Jesus Christ?

I encourage you to be vigilant. Avoid the mistake of just doing what everybody else is doing. Listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ.
