HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY MOM!

Did you know that in 1905, in order to honor her mother, Anna M. Jarvis worked to establish a special day to honor all mothers? She wanted to continue work begun by her mother, Anna Marie Reeves Jarvis who was the founder of Mother's Day Work Clubs that were organized to improve sanitary conditions in her city. Eventually, Woodrow Wilson declared Mother's Day a national holiday in 1914!

Did you know that a mother - the mother of King Lemuel - wrote out the ABC's of a Virtuous Woman sometime before 900 B.C.? We can learn from what she wrote by reading Proverbs 31:10-31. Although it is not apparent in English, interestingly as she wrote, she really did begin each verse using the letters of the Hebrew alphabet in order - Alef, Beit, Gimel, Dalet . . . I wonder as she wrote to her son- was she making it easy for him to remember his mother's advice as he considered finding a wife? O those Jewish mothers- they always have the best advice don't they?

THE GOSPEL AND CULTURE

God Wants YOU to Tell Somebody!

There is much discussion these days as to how the Church should reach the prevailing culture with the spiritual good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Some would say that we should purposely become culturally relevant using the language, dress, music and media of the day to display that we are not so different and certainly not to be feared. In this mindset, we would earn the right to speak by displaying a similar lifestyle and conducting ourselves in everyday life as they do (the same as we do in other mission fields). Others would say that the prevailing culture needs us to be different than they are and that when we become too much like them, that we have nothing of value to offer. In this mindset, we would lose the right to speak by becoming too culturally relevant. In either case, the goal would have been to build a relationship, to love them and ultimately earn the right to share the good news of God's love and eternal life through Jesus Christ.

We can find Scriptural precedence for fitting into culture and Scriptural precedence for being different from culture. In

1 Corinthians 9:19-20, Paul reasoned, For though I am free from all men, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win the more; and to the Jews I became as a Jew, that I might win Jews. . . In Romans 12:1,2 the same author said, I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world. . . These Scriptures illustrate the point readily and simply.

As Christians we are of course in the world, but are not to be of the world. There is a balance to be found when it comes to just how we fit in the surrounding culture. We can understand that it is not so much in dress and outward appearance where the line is drawn but more in behavior and attitude. But often it is by our outward appearance that we are judged – sometimes accurately and sometimes inaccurately

I would challenge you to not be so caught up in the message that comes

from our outward appearance, one way or the other. I would encourage you to be yourself and let God use you according to your (righteous) preferences and personality. Remember these words from I Samuel 16:7, The LORD does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart.

If you are a believer, the Lord desires to use you - will you let Him? Paul said, I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. (Romans 1:16) The importance of the message always supercedes the messenger no matter what. So whether you are the Ward Clever type, or the 50 year old hippie type, or the jock or the biker dude type who is telling someone about the love of God through Jesus Christ - YOU are allowing God to present His unchangeable message through you, while we live in changing times.

Be not ashamed - go tell somebody!

Barna Group survey finds 33% of adults in "Christian America" (more than 100 million people) are unchurched - meaning they have not attended any type of religious service during the past 6 months. The unchurched rate varies among population segments: 47% of political liberals vs. 19% of conservatives; 25% of. African Americans compared with 32% of whites, 34% of Hispanics and 63% of Asians; 37% of single adults vs. 29% of married. 61% of adults associated with a non-Christian faith are unchurched, but just 24% of self-designated Christians. Only 1% of evangelicals do not attend church regularly vs. 32% of adults who call themselves Christian but are not born again. 25% of Catholics and 20% of Protestants are unchurched.
