ON GIVING THANKS

The English colonists, those whom we call Pilgrims, included days of giving thanks in their calendar because of a deep conviction toward God and His Divine Providence. These were not normally days of feasting, rather of fasting and prayer.

In that first year of their settling of this land, the Pilgrims had built seven houses, a common meeting place and three storehouses. They had much for which to be thankful after barely surviving the first winter, and if it were not for the knowledge and help of the Wampanoag, they would not have made it. In 1621 the Pilgrims joined together to give thanks. They invited the Massosoit and the Wampanoag to join them.

The food feast would have been different from what we enjoy. There was probably no turkey. Mashed potatoes and cranberry sauce were yet to be invented! In Plimoth Bay, ducks were plentiful as well as seafood. The Wampaonoag would have provided venison. In addition things

such as corn, cabbage, onions, and squash would have been enjoyed.

We continue to give thanks and as the Pilgrims did, we too, do so with deep conviction toward God and His Divine Providence. Let us meditate upon His love, His grace and His mercy taking us where we need to be – in His Presence. As you celebrate, make sure that the most important item on the menu is the giving of thanks to Almighty God.

Rejoice in the Lord always. Again I will say, rejoice! Let your gentleness be known to all men. The Lord is at hand. Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with **thanksgiving**, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

We will conclude our examination of two probing questions that Jesus asked His disciples and in turn asks each of us. The questions are, "Who do you say I am?" and "Do you love me?" Our most recent study has been of the second question, "Do you love me?"

We have dug deep into a post-resurrection scene of Jesus' life with His disciples where He has met 7 of them who had returned to Galilee and Lake Genesarret following His crucifixion. They had fished all night yet caught no fish. Early in the morning Jesus appeared on the shore and told them where to cast the net – and the disciples could not pull the net into the boat as it was so full of fish – 153 in all. Once on shore, the disciples shared the breakfast that Jesus has prepared.

NOW to the intensity of the scene - remember that two Greek words will become significant here - they are agapao and phileo - agapao is translated love and means a deep, abiding love which takes action toward the benefit of the beloved, one in which emotion is not the prime motivator whereas phileo is translated love and carries the meaning of a tender affection, a good friendship that cherishes the relation-

ship more than the purpose behind the relationship.

We find Peter before the Lord and the 6 other disciples when Jesus asks a series of three questions to Peter and he answers. Here's how it flows:

- 1. Jesus "Do you love (agapao) me more than these?" Peter - "Yes Lord, You know I love (phileo) you."
- 2. Jesus "Simon, son of Jonah, do you love (agapao) me?" Peter "Yes, Lord: you know that I love (phileo) you."
- 3. Jesus "Simon, son of Jonah, do you love (PHILEO) me?" Peter "Lord, You know all things; You know that I love (phileo) you. "

You see Peter wasn't really answering the question Jesus asked. Jesus asked if he loved Him with a deep, abiding, obedient, self-sacrificing love. Peter answered that he had an emotional (I do not want to lose you) attachment for Jesus. Ultimately, Jesus asked – so do you (even) love me with that kind of love? That is why Peter was grieved.

You must remember that Peter had previously told Jesus that he was committed to Him more than any other person. He

was so sure of his love that he told Jesus he would never deny his love – but the same night denied **three times** that he even knew Him! **Three times** Jesus probed and **three times** stated to Peter that he was still usable in His kingdom by telling him to proceed with "feeding His flock."

Some lessons for us:

Maybe when Jesus does not fulfill our expectations, we too have a tendency to go back to the way we used to live and do the things we used to do!

Maybe when we think we would never turn our back on Jesus that in certain circumstances we just might!

Maybe our commitment isn't so much greater than everyone else's.

Maybe what we think is agapao is really phileo!

Maybe we think we are unusable, but Jesus knows we are usable!

Get real, Get humble – Get real humble and get back to serving God according to His desires.

BIG MAC VS. BIG 10

A Kelton research study found 80% of Americans knew "two all-beef patties" were among the ingredients of a Big Mac, while just 60% could identify "Thou shalt not kill" as one of the Ten Commandments.
