NEW SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES BEGIN NEXT SUNDAY

December-February Elective Classes

Having a Mary Spirit - Allowing God to Change Us from the Inside Out - You long to serve God with grace and strength, to reflect Christ in every word and action, yet you find yourself continually struggling to bring that vision to life in your daily walk. Divine Intervention: How to Minister to Friends and Families Dealing with Addictions - When people think of addiction, usually illegal drugs are in mind. Since all sin is addictive, the subject goes far beyond that. Usually people try to minister to the addict instead of to the addict's family and friends who are also dealing with the fallout damage. This class is for people who need to minister to addicts, whether it is a family member, a co-worker, or a friend. This class will also equip people who may not be dealing with it now, but more than likely will be at some point. Studying the Biblical principles explained in the book Divine Intervention (by Mark Shaw), this will bring encouragement and hope as well as enable you to best help your addicted loved one in a Biblical manner. Taught by Pastor Jeff in Room the Dining Room.

A Biblical Understanding of the Nature and Work of Christ - In this class, lecture time will be devoted to understanding the Biblical view of Christ's life and purpose. Students will be challenged to view Christ's life from His pre-existence to His incarnation to His ascension to His eternality.
