### **Questions at the Crossroads of Life**

"To what shall we liken the kingdom of God?" "What is Truth?" "Who touched me?" "What is your name?" "If I tell you the truth, why do you not believe me?" "For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world and loses his soul?" These are a just few of the questions Jesus asked as He walked this earth.

Jesus masterfully could get to the crux of any matter and often did so by asking direct, pertinent, heart searching questions. The questions He asked in the first century resound yet in the hearts and minds of men and women in the  $21^{\rm st}$  century.

Here are two of His questions that every person must take the time to answer. "But who do you say that I am?" and "Do you love Me?" These questions were originally posed by Jesus to His disciples, the first during the third tour of Galilee and the last after His resurrection but before His

ascension into Heaven. Attention to the texts reveal that Peter, the outspoken, natural, sometimes raw, leader, answers for the group when the first question is asked and answers in front of the group when the second question is asked.

But who do you say that I am? (Matthew 16:15) Peter answered by declaring that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God. We have come to refer to this answer as the Great (or Good) Confession. Scripture further reveals that Jesus is God, that Jesus is Holy, that Jesus is the Savior, that Jesus is the only object of saving faith, and that Jesus is Lord and Judge of all. So how have you answered the question, "Who do YOU say that I am?"

**Do YOU love me?** (John 21:15-17) Peter had denied knowing Jesus three times

previously. Here Jesus ultimately restores Peter to usability for ministry by three times having him examine the depth of his dedication by pondering the question, "Do you love me?" Notice that the evidence of love that Jesus desired for Peter was that he would return to the feeding of Jesus' flock. In other words Jesus was saying, "Peter, let your love for me be demonstrated in caring for others as I have assigned you to do." How would answer His question, "Do YOU love me?"
