PRAYER IN THE CHURCH

I recently listened to several sermons on prayer by John Piper* and found them to be helpful so what follows is in large part a very brief summary of those messages and I commend them to you. You can read or listen to them by going to the resource library at www. desiringgod.org Romans 12:12 - Be... rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in prayer; NKJV

Paul expected and in fact gives the church an imperative to be devoted to prayer, it does not mean that prayer is all you do but it does mean that there will be a pattern of praying that looks like a devotion to prayer.

Praying in crises only, or only at meal times or only at bed time are not good indicators of a life devoted to prayer. First, it is essential that our prayer life be rooted in the reality of the atoning death of Christ on the cross. It is only through our position as justified, forgiven, blood-bought, adopted children that we have any privilege of entry to the throne of God to have our petitions heard. That is why we end prayers with "in Jesus name". The mercy shown to us through the cross will also ground us in overflowing praise and thanksgiving that should be evident in all of our praying.

Piper gives 3 brief answers (not an exhaustive list) to why we pray and gives some explanation but I will only list them here.

- Scripture tells us to pray!
- The needs in our own lives, our families, the church, the cause of world missions and in our society are huge and desparate!
- God acts when we pray!

Then he goes on to give some practical things to consider in being devoted to prayer that I feel are worthy of our consideration. These are pairs of suggestions that form the word FADES. Note that each of these pairs is not either/or but both/and.

F - Free and Formed

Free meaning a spontaneous, unscripted and unstructured pouring out of your soul to God in praise, thanks and petition and Formed being structured using such forms as scripture, prayer lists, books like Operation World and using a pattern of prayer such as the Lord's prayer.

A - Alone and Assembled

This is obvious – sometimes we pray alone and sometimes with other believers

D - Desperate and Delighted

Simply, prayer is a relationship building, means of expression for meeting God with your deepest heartaches and fears but also for meeting Him with your highest joys and thanksgiving.

E - Explosive and Extended

In other words short and long. Some prayers may be a few seconds in duration and others much longer.

S - Spontaneous and Scheduled

This deals with when we pray, we need to have regular times of prayer but there must also be need and context driven conversations with the Lord.

Perhaps one of the most helpful things about Piper's message was that he put these ideas in the context of fostering a relationship with a human we love, perhaps a spouse or a close friend. Think of what these relationships would be like if we only had a scheduled time to be with that person or only spoke from a script or only for a few seconds at a time. What a distorted life it would be! Our relationship with our Risen Savior is no different and must be cultivated and pursued in order to be fruitful and personal.

By the way, I never got to the second message so you will have to check that one out for yourself.

TOLERATING TOLERANCE?

For years evangelicals have forewarned that the social push toward tolerance would not stop with simply being kind to others who do not have a conservative mindset. We are seeing the fruit of the push toward tolerance unveiled in ways that indicating that we have seen only the beginning of the unpopularity toward people like us who continue to adhere to the teaching of and living according to traditional values and moral absolutes. It is increasingly interesting that those who preach tolerance are tolerant toward everything and everybody with the exception of orthodox Christianity and conservative evangelical Christians.

Did you catch the news this week? In California, Gov. Arnold Swarzenegger has signed into law a SB – 777 which is promoted as a new "anti-discrimination" bill. It effectively making terms like "mom" and "dad" obsolete! From The World Net Daily, "The bill provides protections for those promoting alternative lifestyle choices, there are no similar protections

for students with traditional or conservative lifestyles and beliefs. Offenders will face the wrath of the state Department of Education, up to and including lawsuits. SB-777 will result in reverse discrimination against students with religious and traditional family values. These students have lost their voice as the direct result of Gov. Schwarzenegger's unbelievable decision. The terms 'mom and dad' or 'husband and wife' could promote discrimination against homosexuals if a same-sex couple is not also featured," said Tur-(Meredith Turney of Capitol Resource Institute)

Did you also hear/read that now in Portland Maine (as in other places) children in grades 6-8 can obtain a full range of contraceptive devices at the student health center in their school? Who cares what Mom and Dad teach or say!
