## **UNDERSTANDING MISSIONS AT NORTH STREET CHRISTIAN CHURCH** *By Pastor Bob*

The mission ministry serves to coordinate and develop the local, domestic and international missions outreach of NSCC. Not only does this ministry oversee the administration of monthly support to missionaries, it also encourages sending short-term missionaries from NSCC to the various ministries supported by NSCC. The mission budget is separate from the Church budget and is supported through 15% of the Church offering to the General Budget along with other designated gifts. Other areas of ministry include correspondence, special recognition of missionaries, prayer, furlough housing and transportation, and special missions emphases.

Special gifts for missions can be designated and placed in the regular offering any Sunday. Some folks prefer to not have 15% of their regular offering go to missions and instead prefer to give named amounts to the General Fund and to the Missions Fund. ### **GOT CONVICTIONS?**

A verse of Scripture that affected me early on in my Christian walk is Joshua 24:15. That verse says, "And if it seems evil to you to serve the LORD, choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you dwell. But as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD." Joshua challenged the nation of Israel to make up their minds about which way they would go. Would they choose to be faithful to the one, true God or would they continue to flirt with all that they laid their eyes on and bow down to the "small g" gods of the surrounding culture?

It is obvious that household-by-household and ultimately life-by-life, we still must make the same decision. It is the choice of each household (and ultimately of each person) to decide by what convictions they will live. Just like Joshua, the preacher can encourage you to make the right decision but ultimately it is yours to make. A father (and/or mother) can declare just how a family will choose to live, but ultimately as

each child ages, he/she decides his/her own convictions and lifestyle.

Following is a good list of Convictions to Live By, intended to enable you to build your life and/or household upon the solid truths of God's Word. Maybe you would want to adopt them as your own. Here's the list:

- 1. God alone is sovereign, and the Bible is the inspired Word and the final authority for my life.
- 2. My purpose in life is to seek God with my whole heart and to build my goals around His purposes.
- 3. My body is the living temple of God and must not be defiled by the lusts of the world.
- 4. My Church must teach the foundational truths of the Bible and reinforce the convictions that derive from those truths.
- 5. My children and grandchildren belong to God first, and it is my responsibility to teach them Scriptural principles, Godly

character, and basic convictions.

- 6. My activities must never weaken the Scriptural convictions of another Chris-
- 7. My marriage is a lifelong commitment to God and to my husband/wife.
- 8. My money is a trust from God and must be earned and managed according to Scriptural principles.
- 9. My words of reproving, exhorting, and restoring a Christian brother must be in harmony with God's Word.
- 10. My affections must be set on things above, not on things of this world.
- I encourage you to choose whom you will serve and then to live by your convic-
