THE BATTLEFIELD OF YOUR THOUGHT LIFE

Have you taken charge of what goes through your mind? It is true that we may not be able to control what flashes before our eyes in a day's time but we can decide just what we will allow to remain in our mind's eye. Whether it begins with a visual image or a verbal image - our thought life can lead us astray or draw us closer to the Lord.

The Scripture says, "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." (Romans 12:2) and "For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh. For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ . . . " (II Corinthians 10:3-5)

Here we learn that victory or defeat is formulated in the mind! If we conform to the world,

we will act like the world acts because we will think like the world thinks. Transformation takes place through the renewing of the mind. In conversion we no longer think as we once thought. The mind is renewed. There is a new moral sense. There is a new knowledge of our actions and of our thoughts. We now act in a Godly fashion because we now think like God thinks.

We also learn that in this battle for our lives that our weaponry is spiritual and not carnal. There is supernatural (not simply natural) power that works within us. Spiritual strongholds are overcome. Arguments against God and God's ways are defeated.

Victory in our thought life is won by bringing every thought into captivity! Every thought must be analyzed, weighed and measured against the truth of God and His Word. No worldly thought can run wild. No ungodly thought can be allowed to take root. Otherwise we naturally return to our old ways of living as motivated by our old ways of thinking. Proverbs 20:27 says, "The spirit of a man is the lamp of the LORD, Searching all the inner depths of his heart." Let the lamp of the Lord search the innermost parts of your being.

Without a renewed way of thinking you will never begin to be able to live out just what God's good and perfected will is for your life. Every man needs his conscience cleansed and his mind renewed. Take charge of our thought life today!

THE SILVER RING THING IS COMING TO OUR AREA

Saturday, September 20th at Knoch High School in Saxonburg

The Silver Ring Thing is the fastest growing teen abstinence program in the United States and is rapidly gaining international recognition for its concert-style show incorporating music, laser lights, fast-paced video, drama & comedy performances. Through this program teens are able to understand that abstinence until marriage is not only God's plan for their lives, but also the best and only way to avoid the harmful physical and emotional effects of premarital sex. By offering a message of forgiveness and new beginnings the program reaches out to those teens that have become sexually active and offers an opportunity to embrace a "second virginity".

The Silver Ring Thing program was created in 1996 by Denny and Amy Pattyn as a response to the escalating numbers of teen pregnancies in Yuma, Arizona, and was moved to Pittsburgh, PA in 2000. The Silver Ring Thing leadership recognizes that the distribution of condoms or the practice of "safe-sex" will not ensure protection from the physical, emotional and spiritual problems resulting from sexual activity among teens. The only way to reverse the moral decay of any youth culture is to inspire a change in the conduct and behavior from those within the culture. Therefore, the Silver Ring Thing has developed a roll-out plan to help create a culture shift that will reach 20% of the student population and has introduced the SRT 434 programs to aid in the national and international spread and understanding of the message of abstinence.
