ABORTION: A FUNDAMENTAL HUMAN RIGHT – OR WRONG?

On January 22, 1973 the Supreme Court of the United States made a landmark decision ruling that abortion is a fundamental right according to the Constitution. This decision of course has been and remains the catalyst of many debates, has reshaped politics in a significant way and has produced unending offspring in the form of "grass roots" movements, both pro and anti. On January 22, 1974, one year later, 20,000 pro-life advocates gathered on the West Steps of the Capitol to defend the cause of the unborn. This Tuesday will mark the 35th year in a row that such a demonstration has been carried out. Over 200,000 people attended last year's march.

The protest is with a purpose. Let this sink in - every day in the U.S. there are nearly 4000 abortions performed; 10,900 per month and 1,300,000 per year! Since its legalization, over 40,000,000 (40 MILLION) abortions have been occurred.

Rightly defined: abortion is the termination of a pregnancy after, accompanied by, or closely followed by the death of the embryo or fetus; especially: the medical procedure of inducing expulsion of a human fetus to terminate a pregnancy.

Embryo, fetus or pre-born? Depends on where you stand on this tissue issue, as to what it's called and how it's defined. No matter what you call it - no other such "tissue" has the capacity to become a human - and this even in its earliest stages! It's a HUMAN embryo even if it is "just" an embryo! (Can't become a duck per chance!)

"Rights" are at the heart of the issue and the decision. (In this case it is a fundamental human wrong from my perspective.) BUT who do we think we are? How in the world can anyone begin to think they have right to short circuit the rights of that person who has not yet come from the womb? What about his/her rights? We must defend the rights of the pre-born - and not just because it is their "right" but because it is the "righteous" thing to do. We are of that kind of kingdom you know!

Human Life is sacred! Death to the hu-

man life, which only God can give, is never our right. Read up on it - Mat-18:10; Psalm 139:13-15; Jeremiah 1:4,5; Galatians 1:15; Genesis 1:27; Job 10:12; Proverbs 6:16,18; Psalm 8; Psalm 127:3 for starters.

Abortion is still an issue and it is still gruesome - even if we don't want to think about it and want it to just go away. It is unacceptable no matter how many ways you explain it. It's just plain wrong not right!

Been there and done that? Our God is the God of grace - let us help you find His love.

I am so glad my mother didn't abort me - how about you and yours? Pastor Bob

KIDS FOLLOW PARENTS MODELS

91% of kids want to help others, says a new Kid, Inc. study of 6-to-14 year-olds. 58% chose volunteering over playing video games; 38% would rather see money for their gifts go to a worthy cause instead of receiving a present. More than half responded that they have the ability to make a positive change in the world, while 9% said kids who volunteer are "nerds."
