


VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL/DAYCAMP

HOLY OR HOLIER THAN THOU?

Sin tastes sweet . . . Holiness sometimes tastes bitter . . .

1 Peter 1:14-16 says, "As obedient children, do not conform to the evil desires you had when you lived in ignorance. But just as He who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; for it is written: "Be holy, because I am holy."

There was a time I did not like the word holy. It carried with it tones of rigidity, religious inflexibility and self-righteousness. To me holy meant "holier than thou." I knew that I did not want to be that kind of holy toward anyone. So to be holy was not necessarily a goal in my early Christian days. I really didn't like the idea. It was because I really didn't understand it (and I might say that I didn't fully grasp things like grace, mercy and forgiveness either – and not that I have comprehended even after 36 years of Christian living). Back to holiness.

Biblically we have positional holiness which is what is imparted to us when we are born again. We are seen by Him as blameless and a vessel dedicated to one

thing – His glory and purpose. We are separated from sin and set apart to God. That's positional holiness.

Then we have personal holiness – everyday holiness. Living free of sin kind of holiness – but never "holier than thou" holiness. Biblically, this is the very fruit we bear as a result of our positional holiness. We are commanded and equipped to live for Him everyday. In this holiness, we strive to live doing the things that are pleasing to the Father and things that are not sinful. This holiness is worked out before the audience of our Father in Heaven; it is not a competition between "me and thee!"

This holiness is not always welcome. It means saying YES to some things that we may not necessarily desire and saying NO to some things that we may desire. At first this kind of holiness seems like work and is strange to our nature. Later it is so natural and inviting. Jonathan Edwards said, "Holiness is a most

beautiful and lovely thing. We drink in strange notions of holiness from our childhood, as if it were a melancholy, morose, sour and unpleasant thing; but there is nothing in it but what is sweet and ravishingly lovely."

This holiness is made possible by God but it is also a matter of decision followed by obedience. This holiness leads us to desire to behave. We want to please God. We want to love and serve others. We desire to obey the Scripture's authority. We give ourselves wholeheartedly to God and are patient with others who are also in the process. Let's Live Joyfully Holy Lives,
