**ON GETTING LIGHTER**

At the end of each day it has become necessary for me to practice this verse, "casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you." (1 Peter 5:7) If I did not consciously do that, I would be of no purposeful use to God. It takes a lot of years of trying "everything but" before a fellow learns that His Word works - even short verses like this one.

The cares of life are the things that draw us in different directions - the things that distract us and bring on anxiety. I have learned that I cannot do it alone. I do not have the ingenuity, the strength and stamina, the wherewithal to handle even one day's burdens, responsibilities or occurrences.

Jesus said lots about the cares of this life. Here are just a couple of His words.

In the Parable of the Sower, He said, "Now these are the ones sown among thorns; they are the ones who hear the word, and the **cares of this world**, the deceitfulness of riches, and the desires for other things entering in choke the word, and it be-

comes unfruitful."

When He spoke about watching for His Coming Again, He said "But take heed to yourselves, lest your hearts be weighed down with carousing, drunkenness, and **cares of this life**, and that Day come on you unexpectedly. For it will come as a snare on all those who dwell on the face of the whole earth. Watch therefore, and pray always that you may be counted worthy to escape all these things that will come to pass, and to stand before the Son of Man."

Filtering it out - we find this to be true about the cares of this life - they can choke the word of Christ and they can weigh us down! I have found that to be true - haven't you?

Jesus said to watch and pray as we wait on Him. We ought always to be watching and praying about all things everyday. We ought to be experts at deflecting the things that draw us in different directions and the things that bring anxiety - responsibly on HIM for He cares!

I get it now! Jesus said, "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and My burden is light." (Matthew 11) We are yoked and we are burdened BUT with Him the work of the yoke is easy and the burdens of the day are light! He is the care carrier! It works - join me at the end of the day and CAST YOUR CARES ON HIM FOR HE CARRIES YOUR CARES!

**Back to the Conference:** Time will be spent daily in worship and proclamation, personal encounter time, Disciple Groups and recreational activities. This year's theme is MOVE which reminds us that the gospel is the most important thing we can know. CIY says - It is what Paul preached "as of first importance" in 1 Corinthians 15. It gives us hope in that God took action while we were dead in our trespasses and sins. We were helpless, hopeless and separated from God, but God did not leave us there. In love He has moved. The gospel is the story about God coming near through Jesus Christ. It is because of this action—the life of Jesus—that we can enter God's presence, draw near to Him, and encourage others to do the same. **God is the first to MOVE...and because He has, we can.** God always has a plan. He is always on the MOVE. Too often we are content to sit on the sidelines and be a spectator. We want every student who comes to MOVE this summer to have a game plan for ministry in the next year. We want students to MOVE "for the sake of the gospel."

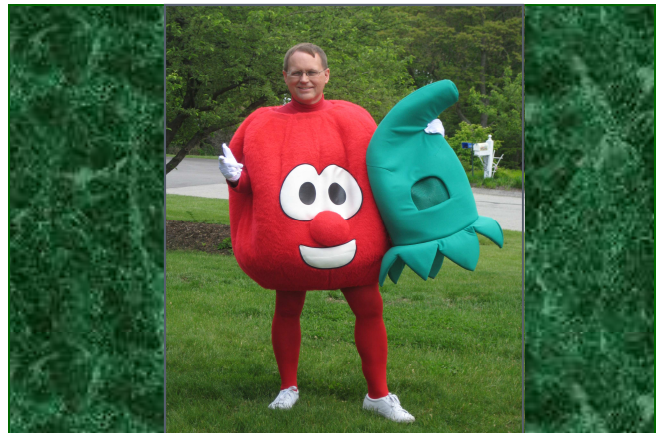
