WE ARE IN DEBT - WHETHER WE WANT TO BE OR NOT!

At NSCC we teach that it is best to live debt-free as this is God's plan for His people. The Scripture teaches that the borrower is servant to the lender. The Scripture also teaches that we should let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another. So in the middle of striving to live debt-free, we do have a continuing debt – **a debt to love one another.** In response, some of us do love one another, fulfilling the debt and some of us do not pay our debt to love one another.

We should meet the debt to love one another simply because we are followers of Christ who has shown us the meaning and extent of love through His life and His death. Loving one another is not always an easy thing to do. It is not always a welcome and natural thing to do. But it is like paying a debt – we may not always feel like making the next installment, but it is due and payable!

The apostle Paul says this in Romans 13:8-10, "Owe no one anything except to love one another, for he who loves another has fulfilled the law. For the commandments, "You shall not commit adultery," "You shall not murder," "You shall not steal," "You shall not bear false witness," "You shall not covet," and if there is any other commandment, are all summed up in this saying, namely, "You shall love your neighbor as

yourself." Love does no harm to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfillment of the law. He agrees with Jesus who when asked of the greatest commandment said that it was to LOVE God and the second was like it – to LOVE your neighbor.

God is big on LOVE. LOVE is the greatest expression of the Christian even greater than faith and hope. LOVE is a command from God to those who follow Him. Get it? LOVING ONE ANOTHER IS NOT OPTIONAL.

Husband who holds your wife at arm's length because of past lack of appreciation – you must make yourself vulnerable by risking love again – God says so. Wife who withholds affection because of your husband's bad track record in loving you – God says to LOVE him anyway and again! Parent's who have been hurt by your child's foolish and wandering ways – LOVE is a stronger glue than the hurt that threatens to separate. Friends who aren't such good friends any longer – apply some LOVE one more time and then another.

We have been taught that love is patient and kind and not envious or boastful. Love is not proud or rude or selfish. Love doesn't get angry too easily and keeps no record when things don't go the way they should. Love gets excited about things that are godly and finds no happiness in anything that is evil. Love is protective and trusting and optimistic and hangs in there even when you feel like quitting. And when everything else seemingly dies – it is love that keeps beating ever so quietly but steadily. IT IS LOVE THAT RESURRECTS RELATION-SHIPS.

So what about you? What will you do about this loving one another thing? In this case, LOVE becomes an action word. Love is more than a feeling. To not love someone and then another and then another is like allowing debt to pile up with no payment intended. Pretty soon you are in over your head so you isolate yourself and avoid others because you owe too much. Life is no fun then.

I encourage you to take inventory of your relationships. Who needs loving from you? Make your TOP 5 LIST and begin applying God's love to your those another relationships. Love like this brings freedom that is not ours otherwise. GOD LOVES IT WHEN WE LOVE ONE ANOTHER!
