MISSIONS - A VITAL LINK FOR MINISTRY AT NSCC

Missions Departmental Meeting/Sunday October 26

North Street Church has a most vital world missions ministry. We have a very close and working relationship with the Saengsirkhuns in Thailand. Barnabas personally relies on Pastor Bob Huber for prayer support, counsel and vision for the church which reaches out to Lisu speaking people in the city of Chiang Mai and for the Lisu, Lahu and Ahka Hill Tribes Churches in the mountains to the north. Much of the financial support for this ministry also comes from North Street Church.

We have very personal connection with the Mitchell's in Romania as Russ grew up right here at NSCC. PB married Russ and Cathy when they served the Lord in the Dominican Republic. Russ presently, through the Lord's grace and the OCI ministry, is making a national impact on the spreading of the Gospel in all of Romania. The Mitchell's are dependent on our prayer and support.

We have a very personal connection with the Houten's who serve with Teen Missions. They are one of us! The Houten family presently lives in Belize and are helping to develop the ministry and campus of Teen Missions there. Primary financial support and much prayer support for the Houten's comes from NSCC.

In addition to these, we have vital links with the DeWitts and Casas Por Cristo, New Directions Farm in Mars Hill, N.C. and Pressing On and our Community Meal Outreach right here in Butler. Just as we have had an economic stir up in the US – so has the remainder of the world. The finances of our missions and missionaries have also been affected. In addition, plans for 2009 must be made. The Houten's have asked that we send some folks to them to build a new restroom facility on their jungle campus. (Materials will be supplied by Teen Missions) We would like to build with Casas Por Cristo again in 2009. In 2010, Pastor Bob would like to lead a team to Thailand once again.

YOU are invited to our missions meeting. We need prayers, visionaries, planners, organizers and every other kind of gifted people to help us make an impact in the world here and now. RESCUE THE PERISHING, CARE FOR THE DYING

"For if I preach the gospel, I have nothing to boast of, for necessity is laid upon me; yes, woe is me if I do not preach the gospel!" There was a distinct passion in the Apostle Paul's life. It was for others to know Jesus as He knew Jesus. For Paul, sharing Christ was not a hobby, a suggestion or an option. To share Christ was the fulfillment of a command and he did it with PASSION.

Most of us do not like commands. Tell us we have to and we won't. Force us and we may. For Paul – I THINK HE LOVED THIS COMMAND! So what would be wrong with that? If we are commanded to do anything by God – why not love what we do?

The plain Gospel is less vogue and somewhat hidden in today's popular Church. We may bring it up after a good concert, a good movie, game night, carnival or car show! Perhaps being so culturally relevant is not so

important as compared to just obeying God's command to *preach the Gospel*. And when we do – it is not for bragging – it is for passionate obedience to God's command. And when we do – we just may LOVE IT too!

Fanny Crosby, the blind hymn writer, wrote so many hymns we love to sing. When she was up in years she visited the Macaulay Rescue Mission in NYC. She stood before a crowd of homeless, drugaddicted, alcoholic men. She said, "Is there a young man here who doesn't have a mother?" One young man timidly raised his hand. He explained she died when he was very young. She asked him to come to the front. She gave him a big hug and kissed him on the cheek. It touched her heart so much that she went home that night and wrote these words, "rescue the perishing, care for the dying,

snatch them in pity from sin and the grave, weep o'er the erring one, lift up the fallen, tell them of Jesus the Mighty to save."

Years later Ira Sankey was singing for D.L. Moody in St. Louis. He rose to sing that song, but before he sang he told that story. As he told the story a middleaged man jumped up and shouted, "It was me! I'm the young man she wrote about. She kissed me. I could never get away from that moment." He explained that as a result he became a Christian and straightened out his life!

Go tell them that Jesus is mighty to save!

Stewardship Notes

THE ECONOMIC EARTHQUAKE OF 2008

In 1991, Crown Financial Ministries late cofounder Larry Burkett wrote *The Coming Economic Earthquake*, warning of the dangers of the ever-growing appetite for debt by our society and federal government alike. Some painted him as a "doom and gloomer", especially in the light of the robust economic growth of the 90's.

The simple advice about borrowing that Larry referenced was based upon Proverbs 22:7, "Just as the rich rule the poor, so the borrower is servant to the lender." God's Word has certainly proved to be true. Our recent economic woes have shouted loudly that biblical principles apply to individuals, families, Wall Street firms, and even government.

Following a reduction of lending standards for the qualification of a home mortgage, millions of borrowers took on debt obligations they simply could not afford. These mortgages were packaged and sold throughout a massive, global network. A bubble of nonsustainable housing prices was created. This set the stage for some of the unthinkable events we have witnessed. Foreclosures escalated in 2006, 2007, and 2008, triggering a real economic earthquake, a financial tsunami, and a breathtaking, wild roller coaster ride as global financial stability teetered on the edge of a

meltdown

This is the most significant financial crisis the United States has faced since the Great Depression, and the aftershocks of these historic events will soon follow. The World as we know it has changed.

We hear both political candidates stating that the root of this financial crisis was *greed*, not only on Wall Street's part, but also by the government, investors, and some individuals who knew that they could not afford the house they were financing. But herein lies the problem. We cannot legislate a solution to greed, since greed is a heart issue.

We individually need to take responsibility and begin to apply God's financial stewardship principles to our own lives, and need to hold accountable our elected officials and federal government to do the same.
