
In this one-day simulcast event, women will learn to conquer fear an doubt and will discover the liberating confidence and security that can only be found in Christ.



FOR YOUR INTEREST: AUTHOR "GOES UNDERCOVER" TO OBSERVE, DOCUMENT EVANGELICALS

Atheistic author Gina Welch faked a conversion experience, got baptized, joined Thomas Road Baptist Church, and even joined an evangelistic missions trip to research her newest book, In the Land of Believers: An Outsider's Extraordinary Journey into the Heart of the Evangelical Church. In an interview with Time magazine, Welch admitted that her experience showed that media perceptions of evangelicals are flawed, and she could even see the appeal of evangelical Christianity. "It's very easy to roll your eyes at the whole culture if you don't have any stake in anyone participating in it...the emotional, intoxicating experience of being at church and hearing that music, and the whole structure of a Sunday service, was moving to me. And I don't believe in God." She said there were indeed some people who "seemed to fit perfectly" with the media's portrait of evangelical Christians—"brainwashed, simpleminded, and angry"-but Welch said the media didn't properly reflect the complexity among believers. When asked if she regretted the undercover facade, Welch answered, "I think it hurt people I (came to) care about...but I think the ability for my book to bridge a gap between evangelicals and nonbelievers mitigates what I did to some extent." Welch closed the interview saying the experience required her to re-examine what she believed to make sure she believed it for a reason; she hoped the book would inspire others to do the same. Comments and blogs on the story range in tone from irritation to curiosity—some complained that Welch's actions were unethical, some found her observations interesting and reflective, and many hoped the experience would actually result in an authentic conversion experience for Welch. Some lamented that Welch only focused on the people of the church and never really searched for Christ Himself, which they say would have resulted in an entirely different report.
