





BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS REPORT


The Building and Grounds Department and the Trustees met recently to set in order a list of projects to be completed with our Building Funds. These projects will conclude Phase 1 of our improvements and make way for Phase 2. The projects in order are:

1. Demolition of Bluff Street House/back fill/gravel for parking

(A contractor for the demolition of the Bluff Street house has been selected and negotiations are currently in progress on the proposal. No date for the demolition has been established yet, but we are requesting it be done before the end of September this year.)

- 2. Paint and Carpet Interior of Stair Tower
- 3. Remodel Kitchen and purchase new appliances
- 4. Remodel garages beneath pre-school for temporary offices
- 5. Demolish 226 North Street presently used for offices
- 6. Relocate garage to west end of parking lot/new siding

The Church Board approved the projects during the July Board meeting held Tuesday July 20. Projects will be completed as funds are available. As of July 26th, the Building Fund balance was \$11,481.53.



TRINITY JAZZ ORCHESTRA BENEFIT CONCERT-Monday, August 16th at 7:00 p.m.

The 18 piece Jazz Big Band will be holding a benefit concert for addiction ministries *Pressing On* and *Freedom*. The concert will feature Christian singer Dave Boyer, who will share his amazing testimony about how God delivered him from a life wrecked by drug and alcohol addiction.

Dave Boyer, a native of York, PA, was well-known in his younger years as the Master of Ceremonies at the "500 Club" in Atlantic City, New Jersey. He performed with Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Jerry Lewis, Sammy Davis, Jr. and Milton Berle. He also served in the armed service. He became addicted to drugs and alcohol and hit rock bottom. His wife left him and shortly after, his father who was a pastor, passed away. Contemplating suicide as he was traveling to the railroad tracks in Marietta, he passed a small

church that triggered memories of his childhood, his father and family, and the happiness he once had. He was brought to his knees in tears and made his way to a phone. He called his brother, pastor of his late father's church, who convinced him to stay until he could get there. They prayed together and Dave was reborn through the Lord. He was re-united with his wife and daughter and they began a Christ-centered life together. They now live in Central Florida.

Since 1966, Dave has brought the Word of God to hundreds of thousands in all corners of the country. He carries a simple message: You are not alone in your day to day struggles, God is always with you.

Dave's unique style of Big Band Gospel music and his powerful ministry and testimony reaches people of all ages. He has performed at the White House for Presidents Ford, Carter, and Reagan.
