Hello, my name is Isabella Daley. I am 17 months old. I was born addicted to MANY different drugs and my intestines were on the outside of my body called Gastroischesis. I had many surgeries and most of my intestines were removed and what is left doesn't work any more. I've never been able to eat, I get my nutrition through a tube that goes into my heart. They said I need something called a small bowel transplant but they couldn't put me on the list until they

found me a Mommy and Daddy that would love me, care for me and not be afraid of my obstacles. So I waited in the hospital alone for 10 months. While I was there, they realized I had a very severe spinal cord injury! My arms are curls inward and my torso is partially paralyzed. I also have many problems with my nervous system because of it. It makes my body do weird things like sweating on only one side, fevers that they can't control and insomnia. One amazing thing is my brain! It is healthy and there is no damage. I will go to school and learn just like you! One day, my social worker, Dana, brought Dave and Betsy and it was love at first sight for all of us! They adopted me without knowing what my prognosis was or if I would ever leave the hospital. Finally I had a Daddy, Mommy, 2 sisters and a brother! Funny thing is they say THEY are the LUCKY ones to have me! I still can't rollover, or hold myself up but my PT/OT friends are helping me get stronger. My Mom and Dad are looking into so many treatments like Hyperbaric Oxygen chamber for healing and stem cell growth, and possibly Germany because they have a lot of great spinal cord treatments there. My doctors also want to help me be more mobile with a power chair that I can activate with my voice since I can't use my arms or hands. We live in the country and my Daddy wants to build me a walkway around the house so I can wheel outside and play like other little kids. When I get my transplant, I will be in the hospital a minimum of 6 months! These things are so expensive. My parents always say, "God will provide". Can you help my Mommy and Daddy? 
