
RENEW: A WEEKEND OF SPIRITURAL AWAKENING CONCLUDES TODAY


"ISRAEL, THE CHURCH AND THE LAST DAYS" BY MESSIANIC RABBI JEFF KIPP

Next Sunday, March 14th, at Both Worship Services



Next Sunday, March 14th, Pastor Jeff Kipp, will be speaking at the 8:00 and 10:15 Worship Services. A Messianic Jew serving at Yeshua Ben David in Pittsburgh's Jewish Community of Squirrel Hill, Pastor Kipp's message is entitled, "Israel, the Church and the Last Days."

Originating from Brooklyn, and starting out as a rebellious Jewish hippie searching for the meaning of life, Pastor Kipp found Jesus through a series of events following his arrival in Taos, New Mexico. By providence he was led



to a Jesus freak hangout where he first heard that Jesus is the Jewish Messiah. He received Jesus into his heart and life.

Continuing to travel, he was led to a Christian Community in Northern California called Lighthouse Ranch where he received a calling to evangelize his Jewish people. He met his wife there and later moved to her hometown of Minneapolis where they became involved with the Messianic Movement.

The Kipps relocated to Pittsburgh and besides leading the Congregation Yeshua Ben David that they began, they work in the private sector to supplement their income. Pastor Kipp is a school bus driver, his wife works at the University of Pittsburgh, his son is a student there and his daughter is a hair stylist. A special offering will be received in addition to the regular offering.

THAILAND TRIP REPORT

Dale Riemer, Andy Bilowich and Pastor Bob departed Chiang Mai, Thailand on Monday evening March 1 at 9:00 p.m. (9:00 a.m. local time). They arrived in Pittsburgh on Tues-



day evening at 7:20 p.m. The 35 hour journey covering nearly 10,000 miles was long - but it was just as exciting to return home as it was to arrive in Thailand two short weeks earlier.

From PB - The last two days of our trip remained exciting. On Saturday we held the dedication of a new Church building in Hui Ko, an Ahka Village near Chiang Dao. Through funds sent from NSCC over the last two years, Barnabas manag-



ing wisely was able to provide needed assets to complete the project although final calculations show that approximately \$700 more is needed to pay for the mortar, flooring and some last minute labor that was needed to complete the project. The ladies in the photo are in their native dress up clothing. The building is approximately 25' by 60'.

On Sunday, following worship and lunch at the Chiang Mai Church of Messiah, we had 5 baptisms using the new baptistery which Barnabas had built in his front yard. The remainder of our time was spent enjoying further fellowship with the Seangsirikhuns and preparing for our departure.

It was another fulfilling and purposeful trip to Thailand. Andy and Dale are good travelers and missionaries. North Street Christian Church and Church of Messiah/Trinity Gospel Fellowship appear to be assigned by the Lord to serve Him together on this side and the other side of the globe. Barnabas sees us a one Church and a mega-Church at that!

In total we worshipped with and or spoke at 9 congregations. Dale and Andy shared a dramatized version of David and Goliath at the Children's ministry in Chiang Dao. Dale was the narrator and Andy was the giant - and a really great one. We dedicated the new Church building in Hui Kho. We held a one day teaching seminar for the evangelists. Five new believers were baptized at the Chiang Mai Church. We ate lots of different food at the villages - including roasted bamboo worms and ant eggs at the Church dedication! We spent some great time with Barnabas and Martha and their family. Lisa was my translator for the evangelists seminar, the Church dedication and on Sunday at the Chiang Mai Church - what a cool blessing that was. We flew close to 20,000 miles and spent around 70 hours in travel to and from. Most of my clothes decided to stay in Bangkok a few extra days - still don't have them as of writing time - Thursday afternoon! Kingdom work was accomplished, relationships were strengthened, memories were made. (I will always be able to see Andy playing with the kids and carrying two or three them around at one time. I will always be able to see Dale and Andy shopping for candy and balloons and happily giving them to the kids and the villages - and throwing pieces out the window of the truck toward kids they may have missed.) WOW - it was good. Lots accomplished and lots to be done!
