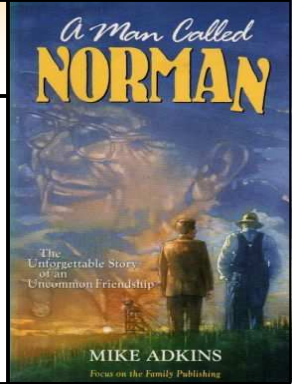
MOVIE NIGHT—A MAN CALLED NORMAN

NSCC EVANGELISM EFFORTS ARE REACHING PEOPLE FOR CHRIST

Bob Ogden along with Pastor Bob are working together in the oversight of the Evangelism Ministry Department. There is a close connection between evangelism and missions outreach. Much of what NSCC is busy doing is either evangelistic outreach or missions outreach in nature.

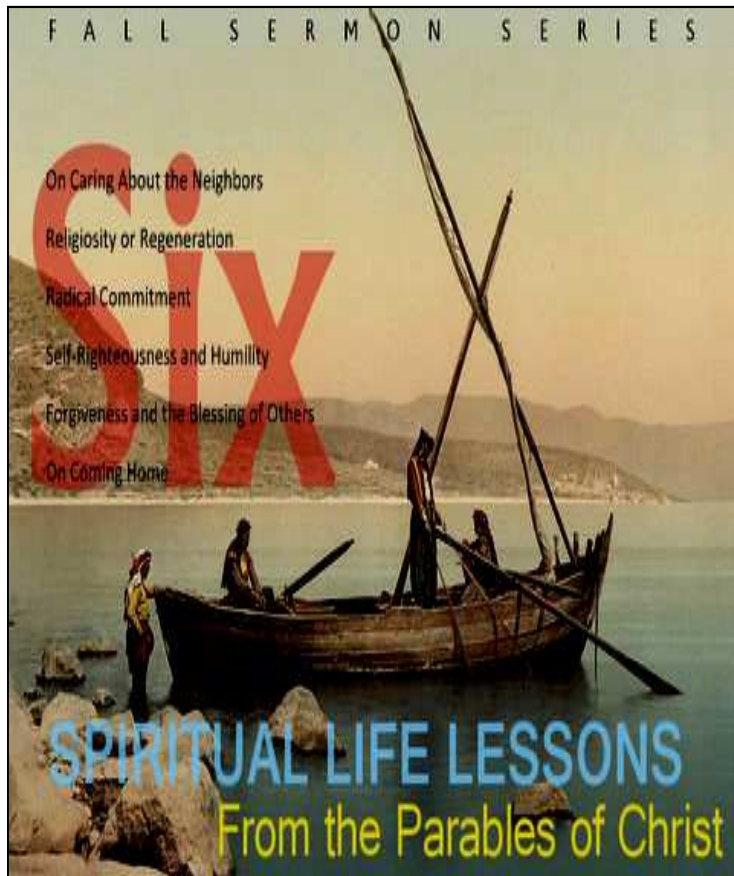
In addition to planning various outreach events, such as the Summer Day Camp headed up by Dennis Muir, and follow-up on Church visitors, Bob O has picked up the preaching and teaching at several locations around the City of Butler.

He and Al Bell have become involved in the Men's Prison Ministry at the Butler County Prison. They team up with Pressing On Ministries and share on the second Friday of each month. Al also goes in on the third Friday of each month. Other members of Pressing On Ministry go in the prison on other Friday nights of the month.

Other locations for preaching and ministry are the Arbors Apartments on Lincoln Avenue on the second and fourth Monday's each month from 10AM to 11AM; the Lafayette Apartments once a month on the last Friday of the month from 1:15PM to 2:15PM and the YWCA Personal Care Home from 2:30PM to 3:30PM also on the fourth Friday of each month.

Communion is served on the fourth week of each month as well. Al Bell and Alan Armstrong also go along on occasion to assist with Communion.
