


# North Street News

It is with purpose that He travels this route, addresses this woman, proclaims who He is, and shows us how to evangelize. This week as we are introduced to the characters and the setting we will just scratch the surface of all that this conversation has to offer.

## "May the Lord of peace Himself continually grant you peace in every circumstance the Lord be with you all." 2 Thessalonians 3:16

God's peace is not a product of our circumstances. It's something we can enjoy in every circumstance. Paul is praying that we would continually remember that God's peace can be enjoyed throughout any situation because it's GOD'S peace. It's not earthy, it's heavenly, it's not temporary it's eternal, it's not found in shaky earthly experience, but unshakable Holy God. In John 14:27 Jesus promised to leave His very peace for us. #### A Word from Pastor Jake

I was thinking about the Jews distain for Samaritans this week and I was reminded of the racist missionary named Jonah. Jonah was told by God to go to Nineveh and preach. Instead of listening to God, Jonah set sail for Tarshish then volunteered to be thrown overboard in the midst of a storm. The heart behind his disobedience can be seen in Jonah's prayer in Jonah 4:1-3. Jonah would rather see the people of Nineveh die in sin and be judged than to see them repent. This shows us the pathetic pride that is within man's heart. However, this story also shows us the incredible mercy and compassion of God. God sovereignly saves the people of Nineveh, even through a prejudice prophet. Jesus, unlike Jonah, ignored the cultural resentment and showed compassion to the Samaritan woman. Let us not loose sight of our mission, which is similar to that of Jonah's, to take the message of the gospel to those who are lost. But unlike Jonah, aim to fulfill your mission with compassion and love like we see from Jesus. ~Pastor Jake
