# Getting Ready for Easter

Easter is only 2 weeks from today. <u>That means Friday, April 18th we will have our Good Friday service here at 7:00 PM</u>. Please plan to come on that Friday and celebrate the sacrificial death of Christ and what He accomplished at Calvary.



For Easter this year, we are asking you to read certain passages each day throughout the last week of Jesus' life. We have put together some short videos for each day of Passion Week to help you understand the timeline of Christ's final week before the résurrection. Make sure you pick up the reading list before Sunday, April 13th, and plan to follow along as we track Jesus coming to be the Passover Lamb.

## Meditate on Him

Every year, Easter seems to do the same thing in my life. I start the season with a busy schedule, and the events and extra services make it even busier. But, as I dwell on the résurrection of Christ, the amount of things I have to complete seems minuscule compared to the reality of what the résurrection means to us. Christ rose from the grave in victory. Christ's résurrection made our faith worth something. It has freed us from the reign of sin. It seals the hope of eternal life, not the perishing of those who die in faith (1 Corinthians 15:17). The Christian has no Savior but Christ, no Redeemer but Christ, and no Lord but Christ. If Christ is not raised, He is not alive, and our Christian life is lifeless. We would have nothing to justify our faith, our Bible study, our preaching or witnessing, our service for Him, or our worship of Him. We would be worshiping a dead man. We would have absolutely nothing to justify our hope in this life or the next. We would be fools and most to be pitied as Paul stated in 1 Corinthians 15. But God did raise Jesus from the dead, and we are not to be pitied. We are to celebrate and worship in the glorious reality of a risen savior. For He is risen indeed.
