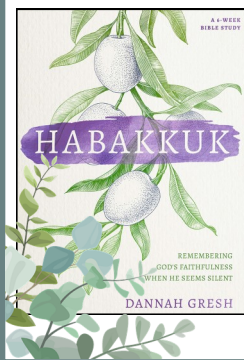
Are you in the battle and are feeling weary?

Commitment to Truth

One amazing thing to learn from the Bible is the commitment to truth. The Bible doesn't purposefully avoid ugly things, it explains them. The destruction of Sodom and Gomorra is a vividly ugly passage in Genesis 19, but the Bible doesn't shrink away from telling us what we need to hear. There are hard passages in scripture. Especially if taught correctly, those passages condemn mankind and the actions that the world champions today. This is one of the reasons that verse-by-verse exposition of scripture is important. Who would choose to preach a passage like Romans 1, which tells of all mankind being abandoned by God and left to their own depravity? But we must preach all of the Bible because it's true. It's God's word. When one only picks the passages they like and ignores the others, they aren't believing in the Bible, they are believing in themselves. They are believing in their own decisions about the text. In today's culture and society, wickedness is vivid. We don't have the liberty to re-write the Bible, or purposely skip pieces of it, to accommodate the world's Godless perspectives. Just like the Bible doesn't shrink away from the truth and tells it like it is, we need to boldly stand on the whole word of God as truth and proclaim every word of it.
