Pastor Bob will present a message entitled YOU GOTTA WANNA that evening. The Heart of Addiction by Mark Shaw will be the winter curriculum. 

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE PERSECUTED CHURCH

Sunday, November 8



Churches across the United States and around the world are preparing to "remember those in bonds" (Hebrews 13:3) on Nov. 8, the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church. Begun in 1996, IDOP is a day for intercessory prayer and citizen action on behalf of persecuted Christian communities worldwide.

"As our staff meets with persecuted Christians around the world, their first request is that we pray for them," says Todd Nettleton, Director of Media Development for The Voice of the Martyrs - USA. "IDOP is a day when the collective Body of Christ joins together to answer their request."

Some churches devote the entire day to persecuted Christians, while others hold a special prayer time during their regular services. It is estimated that more than 100,000 churches have taken part in IDOP activities since 1996, and churches in more than 130 countries have participated.

"Our persecuted family is not asking us to pray that the persecution will stop," says Nettleton. "They're asking us to pray they will remain faithful to Christ in spite of the persecution and pressure they face."

North Street Christian Church will join in the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church during morning worship on Sunday, November 8.

The Truth Project is a DVD-based small group curriculum comprised of 12 one-hour lessons taught by Dr. Del Tackett. This study examines the relevance and importance of living the Christian worldview in daily life.

Your worldview – how you look at the world around you. Your worldview – you have one – it is either a good one or a bad one. Your worldview – it is the lens through which you see the world around you – becomes your reality. Your worldview provides the foundation upon which you stand and live. Philosophy, ethics, history, science, anthropology, theology and sociology are all a part of the formulation of your worldview. The Truth Project addresses all of these subjects and in addition probes each student to consider questions such as, "Is there a God?" "Who is Man?" "What is My Purpose?" and "Who Says So?" Dennis Muir leads the Class through this DVD series.

SR High Ministry for 10th-12th graders will meet at the first floor of Legacy House.


