 Beginning Monday, November 2 at 7:00

Some folks – even some Christians - are enslaved and oppressed by habitual sin. They become trained by sin to seek release, purpose and meaning in pseudo-spiritual substitutes, which bring no real satisfaction. In our culture, those long-term habitual sins are labeled *addictions*. Actually – *all sin is addictive and enslaving*. FREEDOM seeks to bring hope to the hopeless and help to the helpless. Bondage may present itself as anger, depression, self-destructive tendencies, substance abuse (alcohol, drugs, food etc.) or involvement in things such as pornography or risk-taking. If you have found yourself enslaved to habitual sin or want to learn more to help another – YOU ARE INVITED TO FREEDOM – beginning Monday evening November 2 at 7:00 at Legacy. Pastor Bob will present a message entitled YOU GOTTA WANNA that evening. *The Heart of Addiction* by Mark Shaw will be the winter curriculum. FREEDOM meetings will be held the 1st, 2nd and 3rd Mondays of each month. Study, Prayer, Accountability will be the format. *It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.*

NUMBERS GUY UPDATE/Let the Church Rise Building Fund Grows NEED 84 More Gifts of \$623.00 to Make Our Goal for 2009!

Just a few weeks ago we all received a letter from Curt Knotick, AKA - The Numbers Guy! He told us that one possible scenario to raising the needed \$62,297.00 for our building fund before the end of the year, so as to take full advantage of the available matching funds, was simply – to receive 100 gifts of \$623.00.



INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE PERSECUTED CHURCH—SUNDAY NOVEMBER 8



Churches across the United States and around the world are preparing to “remember those in bonds” (Hebrews 13:3) on Nov. 8, the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church. Begun in 1996, IDOP is a day for intercessory prayer and citizen action on behalf of persecuted Christian communities. “As our staff meets with persecuted Christians around the world, their first request is that we pray for them,” says Todd Nettleton, Director of Media Development for The Voice of the Martyrs - USA. “IDOP is a day when the collective Body of Christ joins together to answer their request.”

Some churches devote the entire day to persecuted Christians, while others hold a special prayer time during their regular services. It is estimated that more than 100,000 churches have taken part in IDOP activities since 1996, and churches in more than 130 countries have participated.

“Our persecuted family is not asking us to pray that the persecution will stop,” says Nettleton. “They’re asking us to pray they will remain faithful to Christ in spite of the persecution and pressure they face.”

North Street Christian Church will join in the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church during and following morning worship on Sunday, November 8.

Has Christmas lost its significance?




