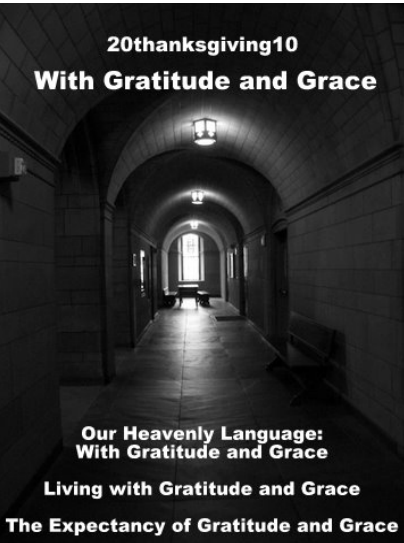

UPDATE ON NSCC MISSIONS

Casas Por Cristo Report—Scott and Jonna DeWitt in Need of Financial Boost



We recently received the following note from Scott DeWitt who ministers with Casas Por Cristo building houses for the poor in Mexico. The note is as follows:

Dear Friends,
I am writing this to you all to first and foremost ask for prayer. Please pray for our financial support as we serve here along the U.S. Mexico border. Currently we are nearly \$2,000 in the red in our support account. If you can, would you consider making a one time donation to help us fill this gap? Barnabas Seangsirikhun Shares A Report from Thailand Preaching in Refugee Camp is a Great Need at This Time

Following is communication recently received from Barnabas (with some editing for increased understanding):

Dear Brother Bob,
Unchana is in the hospital since November 4. Hopefully she will be coming home by tomorrow. She has had a fever and lung problems. I have had a cold since November 3, and have spent some time in bed since then. Anyhow, I am getting better but still weak.
If we have some funds available, we would like to continue preaching the Gospel in the refugee camp. I was the only one that preached the Gospel to refugees so far. Other people gave help but not the Gospel. The refugees are under guard and fenced in. For sure, some of them will be coming to the States sooner or later. If we preach to them now it would be better.
I got calls from the refugee camp very often and asking for help to be able to preach the Gospel in the camp. I had good contacts in the camp that is how God paves the way for their salvation through me. Today I got a call from the camp and said that the gun fires along the border and many Burmese refugees flooding to Thailand. They had many refugees already but now more people coming again. And the place where I had preached the Gospel last time is now filled up with many small huts.
If our friends are interested in this ministry, I would like to go there and help them and would like to share the Gospel to them. If we can make another relief trip, I would like to focus on leaders to preach the Gospel. As for me I know the people, the road, the language, and the Bible.
Your money will carry the Gospel seed to them. Thank you very much for your support and prayers. May God bless you.
