

JEWISH SEDER MEAL WITH PASTOR JEFF KIPP


On Tuesday, April 12 at 6:30, we will hold a traditional Jewish Seder Meal with Guest Speaker Rabbi/Pastor Jeff Kipp of Chosen People Ministries who will speak on the subject, The Messiah in the Passover. Chosen People Ministries is an over one hundred-year-old mission that was founded in 1894 by Leopold Cohn, a Hungarian rabbi who came to believe that Jesus is the Messiah promised by the Hebrew Scriptures. From humble beginnings in Brooklyn, New York, Chosen People Ministries has grown into a worldwide ministry to "the Jew first and to the Gentile." The Messiah in the Passover presentation is a powerful visual message not only of Israel's freedom from slavery in Egypt, but of the redemption of individuals from the bondage of sin through the atoning work of Jesus. The program is designed to give participants a deeper understanding of both of Passover and of the Communion table.

Messiah in the Passover begins with the traditional Passover Seder table—complete with all the articles of this important Jewish celebration. The speaker will explain the symbolic meanings of the various items of the Passover feast and highlight their relationship to the Last Supper that Messiah celebrated with the disciples, giving special emphasis on the redemptive significance of the crucifixion. There are approximately 30 free tickets still available. Each reserved seat must include the name of who is using the ticket.

EASTER SERMON SERIES BEGINS TODAY JESUS THE CHRIST

The 2011 Easter Sermon Series is entitled JESUS THE CHRIST. The emphasis is upon understanding biblically who Jesus is, why He came, and what it is that He has accomplished. Barnabas Reports on Earthquake in Myanmar & Thailand

Hi Bob,

On March 24 at 9 pm and 11 pm the earth quake shocked while we were holding meeting in Nong Kiew. The quake damaged property and more than 100 people were killed in Myanmar. Our fellow evangelists from Myanmar gave me a call and told me what had happened there. They said a newly built Lahu Church's dedication service was finished and followed by that a Bible seminar.

On the last night of seminar the quake shocked immediately and the roof of the Church dropped on to sitting congregation. More than 20 people were killed and 60 people were sent to hospital. A preacher went to bed early with his baby girl. The shock broke the wall and it fell on father and baby. The baby was safe but the father got killed. The three storied house was sunk down and the third floor rested on above the ground and the first and the second floors were sunk under the ground. The husband was on the third floor and saved but wife got killed as she was on the second floor.

There are big cracks on the road and at farming field. Now I am here in Chiangdao and will go to a Lisu village for the night. Today almost the whole day I was on phone even in my driving. Busy day!

I went home to Chiangmai on Saturday after I preached at Pamai. I left Pamai at midnight. I arrived home at 1 am. Sunday morning. Yesterday after service I had a long nap rest. I need to buy some Lahu, Shan, Lisu and Burmese Bibles. We have six Shan new converts recently. Please Remember our ministry in your prayers. Thank you.

On Saturday evening March 26, the Girls Basketball Team and their coaches and families got together in the Church Dining Room to share a meal some great memories and encouragement. One of our players, Angela wrote the words that follow:

Remember who you are playing for girls! Over the course of this season, I've learned a myriad things from everyone on my team, including my coaches. Among these are strength, faithfulness, and the meaning of really loving your neighbors. By strength, I not only mean physical



strength, considering the injuries to half the team, but mental strength, as well. It is easy to stay strong and happy when things are going right, but to maintain honor when faced with adversity is a much more respectable accomplishment. Losing the playoff game epitomized this for me, as we were still able to come together and praise God for the successes of the season and for the opportunity to play as long as we did. One of these successes was being able to play clean games and never be disheartened, even when our score was less than optimal. Regardless of how many times we got knocked down over this season, literally and figuratively, I know we've been strong. Calamity is the test of integrity, and we've passed this test with flying colors. We will never have to answer for why we didn't win our games, because we know who we're playing for, and the score really doesn't matter. I can't imagine God really caring who won and who lost, because the score is not the point of these games. When I'm 85, I won't remember the numbers on the scoreboard or which teams played dirty. I will remember the incredible people I played with, and the practices, games, and friendships that created great memories and a better relationship with myself and with God. Another thing my team has taught me has been faithfulness. It isn't always easy to lead a Christian lifestyle in school or at home, but my team has good attitudes that encourage a love for God and for each other. One of my favorite things about playing on this team has been the positive attitudes, which have changed my own for the better. Through our successes and failures, we have grown as people, and also grown as friends. My teammates have taught me to love my neighbors. When faced with a rival team who is clearly conflicted as to who they are playing for, we develop an almost chauvinistic attitude. We're protective of each other because we act as a family. My team is made up of girls who I know are amazing people, and I have grown to love them all. I'm appreciative of this, and appreciative of how far we came since the beginning of the season. For our first year, I think we did well. And next year, I know we will do even better, while still upholding our morals and sense of pride. My team has inspired me to go after my goals, but to always remember who I am. More importantly, it has taught me who I play for.—Angela
