#### Produce to the People Butler County

Produce to the People of Butler County is the 4th Tuesday of each month beginning in July (July 26, August 23, September 27, October 25, November 22, December 20) from 4-6 p.m. at Butler City Farmer's Market, 205 S. Chestnut St., Butler, PA 16001. It is a free food distribution of fresh produce for any household earning less than 150% of Poverty line, members on Social Security Disability or Retirement, Medicare, Medicaid, Unemployment Compensation, or if in a temporary emergency condition. No proof of need is required, but you are certifying, under penalty of perjury, of need. This will not interfere with your ability to go to your local pantry. Flyers with listings of household incomes to qualify are available at the Welcome Center.

## COMMITMENT TO ONE ANOTHER

I recently read an article from James MacDonald of Harvest Bible Chapel in Chicago. The article was entitled **FELLOWSHIP AND COMMITMENT**. Here are some excerpts which speak to us as we live out our lives in “one another” Christian relationships. **Genuine fellowship requires commitment.** Philippians 1:5 tells us, “...because of your partnership (or fellowship; it’s the same word) in the Gospel from the first day until now.”

Notice, “from the first day until now.” Starting in a relationship is easy; continuing in relationship is difficult. There are no enduring relationships without forgiveness. And that requires commitment. The greater glory goes to Jesus Christ—not when we take our marbles and go home because something didn’t work out the way we wanted it. The greater glory goes to Jesus Christ when we pursue and persevere in relationships in spite of the shortcomings that we see in one another.

Here are four things that break down commitment and destroy fellowship:

- **Christians cease to be committed to one another when entitlement takes over.** When you come to church to get rather than to serve. God protect us from an entitled heart. “I deserve to get. I must have. I can’t continue if I don’t receive.”
- **Christians cease to be committed to one another when superiority raises its ugly head.** Don’t think that your opinion is so worthy that you would break fellowship with someone just because they don’t see it that way.
- **Christians cease to be committed to one another when agendas rule:** doctrinal, business, or ministry. If it’s about your stuff rather than about Jesus, it doesn’t belong. On the majors? Conviction. On the minors? Tolerance. In all things? Love.
- **Christians cease to be committed to one another when injury isn’t forgiven.** Genuine fellowship includes hurts sometimes, but it’s also the best place to find healing!

Where there is no commitment; relationships can’t experience the fellowship Christ desires for us. It’s not about you or about me. It’s about growing in love together for the glory of Jesus Christ.

Let’s live it out – being **COMMITTED TO ONE ANOTHER!**
