

**WE'RE LOOKING FOR AT LEAST 12 STUDENTS FROM NSCC**

MOVE is a 5-day high school only event held all over the country, designed to amplify the call of Christ on student lives to become Kingdom workers for the sake of the Gospel. We have a goal of recruiting at least 12 students from NSCC to attend this year's MOVE event to be held at Anderson University in Anderson, Indiana. Departure will be early Monday morning the 13<sup>th</sup> with late night return on Friday the 17<sup>th</sup>. The cost is \$269.00 per student which includes housing and 12 meals as well as the MOVE experience! NSCC will help fund the cost for each student.

MOVE 2011 is all about what happens when normal people jump into God's radical plans. Told through the eyes of five Biblical characters, MOVE 2011 will showcase the story of God's hope for us all. It will teach of God's desire for us to be faithful, bold and attempt to change the world. They will leave MOVE 2011 knowing that God is working on **something bigger** than we could ever imagine.
