## Electronic Giving - Now Available!

NSCC invites you to consider our new electronic giving program as an easy alternative for your regular giving. Electronic giving offers convenience for you and helps the ministries of the church by providing more consistent giving. We anticipate that electronic giving will appeal to many people - from long time worshippers who will appreciate an alternative to frequent check writing to those who may prefer to give by electronic means whenever possible.

**Direct Debit Giving** is used to automatically transfer funds from your checking or savings account to the church's bank account. If you are already using direct debit to make mortgage and car payments or to pay utility bills, then you know how it works.

You may designate whether your donation is a one-time gift or a recurring gift and you may also specify whether the gift is for the general ministries of the church, the Memorial Fund in memory of a loved one, support for our mission team to Mexico, or a gift to the capital campaign.

30 Hour Famine – May 18 –19 Support our youth!

**Fact: A child dies from hunger-related causes every 8 to 12 seconds.**  
That's as many as 11,000 children younger than 5 — killed every day. Some actually starve. The immune systems of others are powered down by malnutrition, leaving the door wide open for deadly diseases.

And hunger is only one threat facing kids. In all, more than 22,000 die every day — almost all of them from simple causes with existing cures: diarrhea, malaria, pneumonia, hunger, and more. That's the real injustice — that the vast majority of these deaths are 100% preventable.

**Fact: Globally, 925 million people are hungry.**  
That's roughly 3 times the population of the U.S. going to bed hungry every night.



**Why so hungry?** Many families depend entirely on what they can grow, so they're never more than one natural or manmade disaster away from hunger. Others work day and night, but still can barely afford enough food for their children.

While the dates of our 30-hour famine have changed, the importance of it has not. People all over the world are hungry and we want to help. For 30 short hours the youth of North Street Christian Church and Moniteau high School will not eat in order to raise funds that will go towards providing hungry families with something to eat. While not eating will be something new for a lot of these kids it will not help feed those in need on its own. Everyone can be involved in the famine through support. Grab a youth from North Street and support them in feeding the world. The teens are given mission packets and will need to raise funds, which will be sent to provide food for those that are in need. You can support them with so much per hour (one dollar a hour would add up to 30 dollars) or with a gift of any amount you feel led to bless them with. None of us can do this alone. The famine requires participation and support, as a church lets fight hunger.

FAMILIAR PRESCHOOL GUEST



The Pre-K class had a special guest reader for *Read Across America* recently. Chuck Kildoo, Preston's daddy shared with the Pre-K class some of the things that he does at PennDot his workplace and then read the story of Jonah. He explained how Jonah's continual stubbornness and lack of repentance got him into a lot of trouble and how we hurt ourselves and sometimes others too when we do not follow God's instruction. He demonstrated this point by setting up cones on an imaginary roadway closing one lane of traffic and using a stop and slow sign to help traffic run smoothly one direction at a time. The children pretending to drive cars were signaled to drive through the "slow" area while opposing traffic stopped. One driver did not want to obey and wrecked right into another driver thereby, hurting himself and the other driver too!

Mr. Kildoo reminded everyone to pray when we find ourselves in trouble and remember that God is merciful and forgiving! There are some important words each of us should say when we do not obey, "I am sorry. I was wrong." Preston responded to one of his dad's questions and recited an important Bible passage from Ephesians 6:1-3. This is a very important verse for all children to memorize. (I love God's promise here.) "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. *"Honor your father and mother," which is the first commandment with promise: "that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth."*
