Have you ever been forced to play the thankful game? The one where you go around the table and everyone has to say something they are grateful for. The idea of being forced to play it helps paint the picture of gratitude for us. The Bible doesn't leave thankfulness as an option we can choose to have or not have. 2 Thessalonians 2:13 says - "But we ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers beloved by the Lord because God chose you as the first fruits to be saved, through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth."

The first line of that verse says, "we ought always." That means that we should, or it's a responsibility of ours, to be thankful always. However, while thankfulness is a duty of believers, if it feels burdensome, then one doesn't get it. Think of a kid being forced to play the thankfulness game, yet he doesn't want to, and he spouts off something he is thankful for while having a bad attitude. There is no real gratitude as the exercise of expressing thanks burdens him. In opposition to that thought, imagine giving that same kid a present that he really wants. When he opens it and is filled with excitement, he doesn't have to be told to say thank you. He expresses his thanks not because he feels it is a duty but because he is overflowing with the feeling that he was treated well. This is the Christian before God. In this one simple verse, Paul emphasizes that they are "beloved of the Lord." He also points out that God chose them and is sanctifying them through the Spirit. So, the pattern of this verse is that there is a duty to give thanks to God over the church of Thessalonica because of the way God treated them. For the Christian, that's our reality. We have been chosen by God and are now God's beloved. You don't deserve that at all, but that should fill you with an overflowing emotion of being given what you don't deserve. That leads to thanksgiving, which is our duty, but it certainly isn't a burden.
